

ORDINANCE NO. 2437

AN ORDINANCE appropriating \$48,516 allocated to develop Phase II of the Surface Water Program in the 1975 Operating Budget in accordance with Motion No. 1845, and amending Ordinance No. 2230, Sections 5, 49, 52 and 54.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is hereby approved and adopted appropriations of \$5,000 to the Council Administrator, \$5,000 to the Public Health Pooling Fund, and \$38,516 to River Improvement from the appropriation to Special Programs in the Current Expense Fund for development of Phase II of the Surface Water Program in the 1975 Operating Budget in accordance with Motion No. 1845.

SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 2230, Section 5, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

From the Current Expense Fund there is hereby appropriated to: Council Administrator

((~~\$415,217~~) \$420,217)

PROVIDED THAT:

\$5,000 shall be expended only to support development of Phase II of the Surface Water Program. The provisos adopted by the Council in Ordinance No. 2230, as subsequently amended, shall be fulfilled.

SECTION 3. Ordinance No. 2230, Section 49, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Special Programs: ((~~\$2,982,568~~) \$2,977,568)

PROVIDED THAT:

1. The Executive Contingency of \$31,042 shall not be expended unless the County Executive certifies in writing that funds are available and requests that the County Council adopt an additional appropriation ordinance; upon adoption of the ordinance and signing by the Executive, funds may be expended for the purpose specified;
2. When the terms of King County Council Motion No. 1813 regarding reorganization of the Puget Sound Governmental Conference have been met, then application may be made for an appropriation of \$84,255 from the Executive Contingency Fund;

- 3. Support for Washington Parties is contingent upon receipt of a report by the County Council Intergovernmental Committee by July 1, 1975 concerning the activities and accomplishments of the agency for the year together with other pertinent information with respect to need, validity, and benefit to King County;
- 4. \$165,000 is allocated for Social Programs, their expenditure to be authorized by motion of the Council except that there is hereby authorized an expenditure of \$13,500 from this account from the Shoreline Senior Citizen Center; the Policy Development Commission shall review a proposal from the Explorer Division of the Chief Seattle Council of the Boy Scouts of America concerning a career exploration program and shall make a recommendation to the Council regarding the program;

- 6. \$10,000 is provided for a study of the feasibility of the County withdrawing from the Federal Social Security System and establishing its own self-funded system; a report shall be prepared by the County Administrative Officer and presented to the Operations and Judiciary Committee by April 1, 1975;
- 7. Funds are provided in Executive Contingency for the possibility of increasing support to Inter-County River Improvement depending on the impact of State legislation;
- 8. (~~(\$587000)~~) \$53,000 is allocated to develop Phase II of the Surface Water program. (~~(their-expenditure-to-be-authorized-by-motion-of-the-Council)~~)
- 9. Of the total appropriation, \$673,467 shall be used for only Systems Services new development.

SECTION 4. Ordinance No. 2230, Section 52, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

From the River Improvement Fund there is hereby appropriated:

(~~(\$170487229)~~) \$1,086,745

PROVIDED THAT:

- 1. A report shall be furnished to the Public Works and Transportation Committee of the Council by February 1, 1975 relating to the immediate impact of the discontinuation of those capital projects within the Green River Valley, and if such projects are to be reinstated, what impact this will have on future department needs;
- 2. In view of environmental impacts to the Hydraulics Division's long range plan of 1964, the department shall re-evaluate this plan and report to the Public Works and Transportation Committee of the Council by June, 1975 the long-range planning needs for department services throughout King County.

- 1 3. The division shall seek all possible revenue sources or reim-
2 bursements for river maintenance and flood control throughout
3 King County; to this end, the division shall furnish the
4 Public Works and Transportation Committee of the Council by
5 June, 1975, a report of potential sources of cost recovery
6 from incorporated cities and towns and other counties within
7 this region who benefit from river improvement and flood
8 control from King County;
- 9 4. The division shall present to the Public Works and Transporta-
10 tion Committee by March 31, 1975 its recommendations for
11 legislation on water retention on individual properties;
- 12 5. Of the total appropriation ((~~\$5,000~~) \$43,516) shall be
13 expended only to support the activities of the Surface Water
14 Task Force.

15 SECTION 5. Ordinance No. 2230, Section 54, as amended, is
16 hereby amended to read as follows:

17 From the Public Health Pooling Fund is hereby appropriated:

18 ((~~\$3,940,497~~)) \$3,945,497

19 PROVIDED THAT:

- 20 1. The Director shall emphasize reductions in the administrative
21 areas of the Department; necessary services to low income and
22 elderly persons and infant nursing services shall not be
23 reduced;
- 24 2. The Department shall establish and implement an adequate fiscal
25 and management reporting system in 1975;
- 26 3. Approval of the Executive-proposed food establishment program
27 for 1975 is conditional upon passage by the King County Board
28 of Health of a food handling establishment inspection fee
29 schedule;
- 30 4. The Health Department food establishment program shall be self-
31 supporting;
- 32 5. In the event the jail contract is renegotiated, payment for
33 medical care to inmates of the consolidated jail shall be
considered one of the items of negotiation;
- 6. The sum of \$75,000 shall be set aside in the Department budget
to be spent no earlier than the third quarter of 1975 for
additional department reorganizational changes; the Seattle
City Comptroller shall be authorized to release funds from
the Public Health Pooling Fund for the first and second
quarters of 1975 at a rate which includes the \$75,000; in the
event the County Council does not approve release of the
\$75,000 for the third quarter, the total department budget
shall be adjusted downward at that time;

- 8. The six least populous suburban towns shall be charged for
health services on the basis of the average per capita charge
to the five most populous cities.

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9. \$5,000 shall be expended only to support development of Phase II of the Surface Water Program.
