ORDINANCE NO. 8831

AN ORDINANCE appropriating \$371,875 from the unappropriated bond proceeds of Fund 312 to the Harborview Medical Center Long-Range Capital Improvement Project Fund No. 312 and \$53,125 from the unappropriated bond proceeds of Fund 387 to Harborview Medical Construction - 1977 Fund 387 to support programming expenditures, and amending Ordinance 8802, Section 92, Attachments 1 and 2, as amended, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is hereby approved and adopted an appropriation of \$371,875 to CIP Project No. 668291, Trauma Center Bond Project, from unallocated bond proceeds of Fund No. 312 and \$53,125 to CIP Project No. 668294 from unallocated bond proceeds of Fund No. 387.

SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 8802, Section 92, Attachments 1 and 2, as amended, is hereby amended by adding thereto and inserting therein the following:

From the several capital improvement project funds, there is hereby appropriated and authorized to be disbursed the following amount for the specific project identified below:






