A MOTION relating to law enforcement; recognizing the "Keystone Kops" of the International Footprint Association, Seattle Chapter, #17 for their efforts in serving the community, charitable causes, promoting good fellowship between law enforcement personnel and the community; recognizing Mr. Gene Willard the original working founder of the Keystone Kops.

WHEREAS, the International Footprint Association was founded nationally in 1929, the Seattle Chapter beginning in 1940; and

WHEREAS, the purposes of the association are to raise the standards of law enforcement through scholarship, community projects, and

WHEREAS, in 1981, the Seattle Chapter of the International Footprint Association began a program called the "Keystone Kops" and

WHEREAS, the "Keystone Kops", dressed in attire similar to their namesake, perform over fifty times a year to different groups, particularly youth, to show that policemen are "good guys", and

WHEREAS, THE "Keystone Kops" have become the public relation arm of the Seattle Chapter of the International Footprinters Association, working with youth to stress respect for law enforcement, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Gene Willard a civilian has been recognized as the founder of the successful "Keystone Kops" programs,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT MOVED BY THE KING COUNTY COUNCIL:

The Council recognizes the "Keystone Kops" of the International Footprint Association, Seattle Chapter #17 and the program's founder Mr. Gene Willard.
