

AN ORDINANCE acknowledging unanticipated revenue in the amount of \$1,184,790 from the United States Office of Emergency Preparedness, County Project No. 72-PW-229, and appropriating said revenue to the River Improvement and County Road Funds, and amending Ordinance No. 1056, as amended.

WHEREAS, King County has been declared a disaster area by President Richard Nixon for flood damage which occurred between February 13, 1972 and March 10, 1972, and

WHEREAS, the King County will receive \$1,184,790 in unanticipated revenue under the provisions of the Disaster Relief Act of 1970.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Supplemental appropriations in the amount of \$998,164 to the River Improvement Fund, and \$186,626 to the County Road Fund, are hereby approved and adopted, provided that said appropriations be utilized in accordance with the requirements of the Disaster Relief Act of 1970, Public Law 91-606.

SECTION 2. Any unexpended Disaster Relief Act funds remaining at the end of 1972 shall be carried over and appropriated in accordance with the approved Disaster Assistance Application, OEP-328-DR-16.

SECTION 3. Ordinance No. 1056, Section 3, as amended, is hereby amended as follows:
