16	water district No. 90 comprehensive plan, and found that plan met the
17	criteria for approval. The county approved the most recent comprehensive
18	plan in 2008, as part of Ordinance 16314.

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Commissioners of King County Water District No. 90, King County, Washington, accepting annexation of certain area contiguous to King County Water District No., pursuant to the Winterbrook Farms Annexation Petition.

WHEREAS, a petition for annexation to an area hereafter described which is contiguous to the King County Water District No. 90 of King County, Washington, was made in writing, addressed to and filed with the Board of Commissioners of said District; and

WHEREAS, said Petition as signed by the owners; according to the records of the King County Auditor, of not less than sixty (60%) percent of the area of land for which the said annexation was petitioned; and

WHEREAS, said Petition set forth a description of the property according to government legal plats and was accompanied by a plat which outlines the boundaries of the property sought to be annexed; and

WHEREAS, on May 17, 20016, a public meeting was held after proper notice and Resolution No. 1004 passed. Pursuant to Resolution No. 1004, the Commissioners did review the Environmental Checklist wherein they found that an annexation would not significantly affect the quality of the environment; and

WHEREAS, on May 17, 2016, a public meeting was held, after proper notice, and Resolution No. 1005 was passed. Pursuant to Resolution No. 1005 it was proved to the satisfaction of the Board of Commissioners that said Petition for Annexation complied with the requirements of law; and

RESOLUTION NO. 1014 SUBJECT: Accepting Winterbrook Farm Annexation PAGE - 1 WHEREAS, said Board of Commissioners entertained said Petition and did fix the time, date and place for public hearing thereon as the 21<sup>st</sup> day of June, 2016, at the District's headquarters, located at 15606 SE 128<sup>th</sup> Street, Renton, Washington, and did cause notice of hearing to be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the area proposed to be annexed by said Petition, and said public hearing was held at the time and place specified in said notice.

WHEREAS, on July 11, 2016, a SEPA- Notice of Action was signed and issued which provided for a thirty (30) day comment period that closed effective August 11, 2016. The SEPA- Notice of Action was advertised on July 15, 2016, and July 22, 2016, in a newspaper of general circulation in the area proposed to be annexed by said Petition, and was caused to be posted in three (3) public places within the area proposed for annexation;

WHEREAS, no action was commenced to set aside, enjoin, review, or otherwise challenge such action on the grounds of noncompliance with the provisions of chapter 43.21C R.C.W.- State Environmental Policy Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of King County Water District No. 90, King County, Washington, as follows:

**SECTION 1**: That the area contained in the Winterbrook Farm Annexation Petition which is more particularly described in Exhibit "A" hereto, should be and is hereby annexed to King County Water District No. 90; provided that said annexation is subject to the potential review of the King County Boundary Review Board and the adoption of an Ordinance by the King County Council.

**SECTION 2**: That all of the notices be given and application be made and other steps be taken to secure the governmental approval by the necessary authorities of King County, Washington, whose review and approval of this annexation is required by law.

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

We are writing to advise you that the Boundary Review Board has now completed the required evaluation, as specified in RCW 36.93, for the above-referenced proposed action filed with the Board effective <u>September 9, 2016</u>.

The Boundary Review Board also provided a 45-day public review period, as prescribed by RCW 36.93. The Board received no request for a public hearing of this proposed action during the public review period.
