

WHEREAS, the President of the United States, because of the significance of the occasion of the astronauts from Apollo II landing on the moon on Monday, July 21, 1969, has designated Monday, July 21, 1969, to be a day of national participation and has urged governmental units and private business to declare said day a holiday, and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Washington, the King County Executive, and the Mayor of the City of Seattle, have by proclamation designated Monday, July 21, 1969, a legal holiday, and

WHEREAS, the King County Council has by proper legal notice set July 21, 1969, as hearing date for certain matters to be considered by the King County Council, and

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of the Prosecuting Attorney that those matters on the Calendar requiring public notice be re-published and a new hearing date scheduled, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED that those items appearing on the Calendar of July 21, 1969, requiring public notice be re-published for hearing on August 18, 1969, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all other matters appearing on the Calendar for July 21, 1969, be continued for hearing at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the King County Council.
