THE KING COUNTY COUNCIL DECLARING:

South 107th Street (Empire Way South to 51st Avenue South)

A NECESSITY:

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable by the County Council of King County, Washington, by majority vote, that a road known as;

South 107th Street

be established not less than 84 feet in width, having 42 feet of such width each side of the following described centerline:

Beginning at a point on the centerline of Empire Way South in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 3, Township 23 North, Range 4 East, W.M., King County, Washington, said point being 678.90 feet southerly of the east-west centerline of said Section 3, thence in an easterly direction, a distance of 2678.74 feet to a terminus on the centerline of 51st Avenue South, 44.53 feet southerly of the East $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of said Section 3, Township 23 North, Range 4 East, W.M., King County, Washington.

2678.74 feet or 0.51 mile

The King County Council finds that the establishment of said roadway along the course and description set forth is a public necessity and directs the Director of the Department of Public Works to make an examination of said road and report upon same as required by law.
