

MOTION NO. 96

THE KING COUNTY COUNCIL DECLARING:

South 288th Street (Pacific Highway South to 51st Avenue South)

A NECESSITY:

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable by the County Council of King County, Washington, by majority vote, that a road known as

South 288th Street

be established not more than 140 feet and not less than 84 feet in width, having not more than 60 feet and not less than 42 feet of such width each side of the following described centerline:

Beginning on the North line of Section 4, Township 21 North, Range 4 East, W.M. at a point 237.88 feet easterly on the northwest corner of said Section 4; thence along said north line in an easterly direction a distance of 10,294.26 feet to a terminus at the northeast corner of Section 3, Township 21 North, Range 4 East, W.M., said terminus being Engineer's Station 102+94.26 at the intersection of South 288th Street and 51st Avenue South.

10,294.26 feet = 1.95 miles

The King County Council finds that the establishment of said roadway along the course and description set forth is a public necessary and directs the Director of the Department of Public Works to make an examination of said road and report upon same as required by law.
