THE KING COUNTY COUNCIL DECLARING:

4th Avenue SW
(SW 150th Street to SW 146th Street)

A NECESSITY:

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable by the County Council of King County, Washington, by majority vote, that a road known as

4th Avenue SW

be established not less than 60 feet in width, having 30 feet of such width each side of the following described centerline:

Beginning at a point on the centerline of vacated SW 150th St. said point being the NW corner of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 19, Twp. 23 N., R. 4 E., W.M., thence northerly a distance of 1338.12 ft. to a terminus on the centerline of the SW 146th Street, at a point which is the NW corner of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 19, Twp. 23 N., R. 4 E., W.M.

1338.12 Ft. = 0.253 Miles

The King County Council finds that the establishment of said roadway along the course and description set forth is a public necessity and directs the Director of the Department of Public Works to make an examination of said road and report upon same as required by law.
