A MOTION AUTHORIZING APPLICATION FOR FUNDING ASSISTANCE FOR AN OUTDOOR RECREATION PROJECT TO THE INTERAGENCY COMMITTEE FOR OUTDOOR RECREATION AS PROVIDED BY THE MARINE RECREATION LAND ACT AND THE \$40,000,000 OUTDOOR RECREATION BOND ISSUE OF 1968.

WHEREAS, King County, Washington, desires to develop certain park lands listed below; and

WHEREAS, the voters of King County on February 13, 1968 and by King County Resolution #34571 authorized bond funds for the development of park lands listed below; and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Marine Recreation Land Act, and the \$40,000,000 Outdoor Recreation Bond Issue of 1968 state and federal funding assistance has been authorized and made available to aid in financing the development of outdoor recreational facilities of local public bodies; and

WHEREAS, the County Council, King County, Washington considers it in the best public interest to develop the following park:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the County Council of King County, Washington:

- That the County Executive is hereby authorized to make formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for fund assistance towards the total development of the abovementioned park, and to execute such contracts as are required by said department;
- 2. That the Federal and State Grant Coordinator for King County is hereby designated as the authorized correspondent to provide additional information and to furnish such documents as may be required by said agency;
- 3. That any financial aid through the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation will be used expressly for development purposes as agreed to by the County Council, the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation, and any affected federal agency, and
- 4. That this motion becomes a part of a formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.
