THE KING COUNTY COUNCIL DECLARING:

SW 106th Street and SW 107th Street (24th SW to 22nd SW)

A NECESSITY:

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable by the County Council of King County, Washington, by majority vote, that a road known as

SW 106th Street & SW 107th Street

be established not less than 84 feet in width, having 42 feet of such width each side of the following described centerline:

Beginning at a point on the centerline of 24th Avenue SW at a point which bears S. 67°08'52" W. a distance of 2129.59 feet from the East Quarter Corner of Section 1, Township 23 North, Range 3 East, W.M.; thence in an Easterly direction a distance of 465.97 feet to a terminus at the intersection of 22nd Avenue SW and SW 107th Street, said terminus bears S. 57°02'17" W. a distance of 1915.62 feet from said East Quarter Corner of said Section 1.

465.97 feet = 0.09 mile

The King County Council finds that the establishment of said roadway along the course and description set forth is a public necessity and directs the Director of the Department of Public Works to make an examination of said road and report upon same as required by law.
