THE KING COUNTY COUNCIL DECLARING:

Coalfield Road (136th Avenue SE to SR No. 900)

A NECESSITY:

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable by the County Council of King County, Washington, by majority vote, that a road known as Coalfield Road

be established not less than 60 feet in width, having 30 feet of such width each side of the following described centerline:

Beginning at Section 34, Twp. 24 N., Rge. 5 E., W.M., King County Washington, at a point on the centerline of 136th Avenue SE said point bearing N 68°29'23" W. a distance of 84.97 feet from K.C.A.S. monument, station B-184, said point also being road station 227+80.57 on 136th Avenue SE as surveyed by King County Engineers Survey No. 3-23-5-6; thence easterly a distance of 12,566.94 feet to a point of terminus on the centerline of State Road No. 900; said point bearing S 01°04'19" W. a distance of 713.55 feet from the NW corner of Section 2, Twp. 23 N., Rge. 5 E., W.M., King County, Washington.

(12,566.92 Feet = 2.38 Miles)

The King County Council finds that the establishment of said roadway along the course and description set forth is a public necessity and directs the Director of the Department of Public Works to make an examination of said road and report upon same as required by law.
