

WHEREAS, the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 provides for the making of grants by the U.S. Department of Justice through the Law and Justice Planning Office, Planning and Community Affairs Agency, State of Washington, and

WHEREAS, the County Council recognizes the plight of the Indian parolee/probationer in re-entering the community and rehabilitating himself, and

WHEREAS, the Indian Inn, half-way house sponsored by the United Indians of All Tribes Foundation, was established solely to assist the Indian parolee/probationer and is the only half-way house to serve Indians and also to be staffed by Indians, and

WHEREAS, the County Council endorses the application proposal developed by the United Indians of All Tribes Foundation,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the County Council of King County, Washington, as follows:

1. The County Executive is hereby authorized to submit a grant application to the Law and Justice Planning Office, Planning and Community Affairs Agency, State of Washington, on behalf of the United Indians of All Tribes Foundation.

2. That the County Executive is further authorized to enter into and execute such contracts as are required by the Law and Justice Planning Office.

3. That the Federal/State Grant Coordinator is designated as the authorized correspondent to provide additional information and to furnish such documents as may be required by the Law and Justice Planning Office.

4. That the County Executive is also authorized to enter into and execute such subcontracts as are
