A Motion Relating to a Grant Application for an Emergency Medical Communication System.

WHEREAS, King County is very much concerned with the improvement of emergency medical services throughout King County; and

WHEREAS, direct communications between the hospital and the emergency transportation vehicle has been identified as one of three key problems affecting good emergency medical care; and

WHEREAS, studies have shown that prompt communication between the emergency medical attendant at the scene of an incident and the receiving hospital emergency physicians can frequently result in the saving of lives, or the reduction of disability through two-way communications; and

WHEREAS, the County of King is the most populous county in the State of Washington, and because of the proliferation of multiple agencies both private and public which engage in the transportation and receiving of injured citizens, the magnitude of the problems of ineffective communication are tremendous; and

WHEREAS, with the limited exception of two or three single agency hospital hook-ups, effective communications between the emergency medical technicians and the multitude of receiving hospitals just does not exist; and

MMEREAS, coupled with this there is no effective means for mass communications on a medical basis in the case of multiple injuries involving many agencies and hospitals; and

Ordinating Council has been designated as the official body to advise and make recommendations to the King County Council on matters pertaining to emergency medical services; and

WHEREAS, this Coordinating Council has participated in an endorsement of the grant application of the Seattle Area Hospital Council, for an Emergency Medical Communications System for King County, submitted in the name of the King County Hospital District, for consideration in the fiscal year 1972; now, therefore,

THE KING COUNTY COUNCIL does hereby move to endorse said Grant Application and dispersement of funds; and further, upholds the recommendation of the King County Emergency Medical Service Coordinating Council that communications be among the highest priorities of need in problems to be solved.
