

1 A MOTION requesting the County Executive to authorize
2 employee payroll deductions.

3 WHEREAS, it is in the interest of county employees to be
4 fully apprised of all alternative opportunities available for
5 their participation as a group before such participation begins in
6 order that they may achieve the maximum benefit from such
7 participation;

8 NOW THEREFORE, be it moved by the Council of King County:

9 The County Executive is hereby requested to authorize payroll
10 deduction for mass marketing of auto insurance with the following
11 guidelines:

12 1. Insurance companies must be licensed to do business in
13 the State of Washington.

14 2. The County must have the computer capability.

15 3. The County reserves the right to establish procedures for
16 the payroll deduction process.

17 4. The County reserves the right to require that combined
18 remittances shall be deposited in a trust account.

19 5. All direct payroll deductions shall be sent directly to
20 the carrier, or authorized agent. The County may require the agent
21 to provide an adequate bond.

22 6. A minimum of 250 employees signing a payroll deduction
23 shall be required before the deduction privilege will be authorized.
24 If the number of employees requesting a particular deduction drops
25 below 150 for three (3) months, the privilege will be automatically
26 discontinued.

27 7. The Office of Personnel shall be responsible to receive
28 in writing, investigate, evaluate, and determine the feasibility
29 of all requests for deductions. Requests for deductions shall
30 provide the required information as specified in this deduction
31 policy. Recommendations of approval or disapproval shall be made
32 to the County Administrative Officer.

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8. There shall be a written agreement that the insurance company and/or broker will pay all costs as determined by the Department of Budgets and Accounts.

9. The insurance carrier shall guarantee insurability and non-cancelability to all King County employees that have a valid Washington State driver's license *and who keep their premiums current.*

10. The undersigned understands and agrees that neither this program nor the insurer is endorsed or sponsored by the County Government.
