### IOTION NO. 573

A Motion in connection with the formation of a Road Improvement District to convert overhead electric and communication facilities to underground, and the conversion of existing street lighting facilities to ornamental street lighting facilities in the Innis Arden area.

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WHEREAS, a petition has been filed with the King County Council requesting the improvement of some of the streets and avenues in the Innis Arden area. The improvement contemplates the conversion of existing overhead wiring to underground wiring and the erection of ornamental street lights, and performing such other work as may be necessary therewith. The petition also requests that payment for this improvement be made by special assessments computed on the basis of equal cost for each building site, payable in fifteen equal annual installments, under mode of "Payment by Bond".

WHEREAS, the acting Clerk of the King County Council on June 15, 1971, referred the above said petition to the Director, Department of Public Works, for his checking and recommendation, and

WHEREAS, said Director has contacted Seattle City Light and General Telephone Company of the Northwest, Inc., and they have engineered a plan that is most feasible, and did establish a boundary for the improvement district, and

WHEREAS, the Director, Department of Public Works, Utilities and Transportation, has certified that said petition has been signed by owners of 63 percent of the lineal front footage upon the proposed improvement and 69 percent of the area within the boundary of the proposed improvement district, now, therefore,

MOTION by the Council of King County, Washington is as follows:

SECTION 1: Pursuant to the provisions of R.C.W. 36.88.020, 36.88.050 and 36.88.410, it is the intention of the County Council

The total cost and expense are to be borne 23 by the benefited property owners within the district and special 24 assessments levied on a basis of equal assessment for each build-25 ing site. 26 SECTION 3: It is the intention of the King County Council 27 to establish a road improvement district to be known and desig-

SECTION 4: All persons who may desire to object to the aforesaid assessment district are hereby notified to appear and present such objections at a meeting of the King County Council to be held in Room 402 King County Courthouse, Seattle, Washington at 9:30 a.m., on the 23 day of August, 1971, which time and place are hereby fixed for hearing of matters relating to said proposed improvements and all objections thereto, and for confirming the method of payment as petitioned for this improvement.

SECTION 5: The Director, Department of Public Works, is hereby directed to submit to the King County Council at or prior to the dated fixed for such hearing, a diagram or print showing thereon the lots and other property which will be specially benefited thereby and the estimated amount of cost and expense of such improvement to be borne by each buildable site.

SECTION 6: The Clerk of the King County Council is hereby directed to give notice of said hearing by publication of this motion in at least two (2) consecutive issues of a newspaper of general circulation in such county with the date of the first publication to be at least fifteen (15) days prior to the date of said hearing, and to mail a notice of such hearing setting forth the nature of the proposed improvement, the total estimated cost, the estimated amount of the cost and expense of such improvement to be borne by the particular lot, the date and place of the hearing before the County Council, and the fact that property owners may withdraw their names from the petition or add their names thereto at any time prior to 4:30 p.m. of the day before the hearing, to each owner or reputed owner of any lots, or other property within the proposed improvement district at the address as shown on the tax rolls of the County Department of Finance.
