A MOTION authorizing the County Executive to execute and submit a grant application to the State Law & Justice Planning Office for funds in the amount of \$25,345 to establish a Family Support Project for the families of offenders.

WHEREAS, the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968, as amended, provides for the award of grants by the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration, U.S. Department of Justice, through the Washington State Law and Justice Planning Office, and;

WHEREAS, the County Council recognizes the need to provide support services to the families of offenders involved in the criminal justice system of Seattle and King County, and;

WHEREAS, this grant would provide a means of offering practical help and counseling services to meet the needs of the families of offenders;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

1. That the King County Executive is hereby authorized to make application to the State Law & Justice Planning Office on behalf of King County;

2. That the County Executive is hereby authorized and directed to file and execute such application and contracts as are required by the State;

3. That the King County Law & Justice Planning Office is named the authorized correspondent for King County and is further authorized to furnish such additional information and documents as may be required by the State;

4. That the County Executive is also authorized to enter into and execute such subcontracts as are necessary with the Seattle Mental Health Institute for the implementation of the project.
