MOTION NO. 878

A MOTION authorizing application to the U.S. Department of Commerce, Economic Development Administration, United States of America, for a grant to assist in the construction of an addition to the Solid Waste Division Maintenance Shop at Cedar Hills and assist in relocating and expanding the Cedar Hills field office, under the terms of Public Law 89-136 as amended, and assuring the Economic Development Administration of timely and successful completion of project when funded. (#2PW256)

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Public Law 89-136, as amended, grant funds have been made available through the U. S. Department of Commerce, Economic Development Administration, to private or public nonprofit organizations or associations to aid in financing the construction of specific public projects.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- 1. That the King County Executive is hereby authorized to execute and file an application on behalf of King County, Washington, with the U. S. Department of Commerce, Economic Development Administration, for a grant to aid in the construction of an addition to the Solid Waste Division Maintenance Shop at Cedar Hills and assist in relocating and expanding the Cedar Hills field office. The County Executive is hereby authorized to execute such contracts as the Economic Development Administration may require.
- 2. That the United States of America, Department of Commerce, is hereby assured full compliance with such regulations effectuating Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.
- 3. That assurance is made to the Economic Development Administration that every effort will be made to successfully complete the construction of the project at a cost not greater than approved for funding. However, if such changes do occur, prior approval will be received from said Economic Development Administration.

- 4. That the Federal/State Grant Coordinator is designated as the authorized correspondent to provide additional information and to furnish such documents as may be required by the U.S. Department of Commerce, Economic Development Administrator.
- 5. That further assurance is made that King County will promptly pay all amounts legitimately due affecting the construction of the addition and improvements to the Solid Waste Division Maintenance Shop and field office at Cedar Hills.
- 6. That King County guarantees the successful and timely completion of said project to the satisfaction of the Economic Development Administration.
