A MOTION authorizing application to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for grant assistance on Urban Beautification and Improvement Projects provided under 42 U.S.C. 1500 C-2, Housing Act of 1961, Section 706 as amended.

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development is authorized to make grants under 42 U.S.C. 1500 C-2, Housing Act of 1961, Section 706, as amended, to local public governments for urban beautification projects, and

WHEREAS, King County desires to beautify and improve open space and other public urban land to facilitate their increased use and enjoyment, and

WHEREAS, a local beautification program that is compatible with the local comprehensive plan is one requirement of the grant program, and

WHEREAS, the King County Department of Planning, through action taken on August 23 1972, has reviewed and approved the beautification program and recommends the adoption of said program by the County Council,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

1. That the County Beautification Program, attached hereto, is adopted as the guideline for King County Urban Beautification and Improvement Program projects.

2. That the County Executive is hereby authorized to execute and file an application with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for a grant of \$227,125 (fifty percent of the total project cost) and that King County will provide the balance of the funds.

3. That the County Executive is hereby authorized and directed to execute such contracts as are required by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

1 4. That the Federal/State Grant Coordinator is hereby
2 authorized to provide additional information and to furnish such
3 documents as may be required by the U.S. Department of Housing
4 and Urban Development and to act as the authorized correspondent
5 for King County.

6 5. That the proposed urban beautification projects are in
7 accordance with the beautification program of King County, of
8 importance to the development of King County as reflected in the
9 comprehensive planning, and that, should said grant application
10 be approved, King County will undertake, carry out and complete
11 said urban beautification activities designated in said applica-
12 tion and approved by the Department of Housing and Urban Develop-
13 ment.

14 6. That other governmental units in King County may partici-
15 pate in said federal program under King County's application and
16 program, if so desired, by such governmental units, and that the
17 County Executive is further authorized to enter into a contract
18 or agreement to this end.

19 7. That the United States of America and the Secretary of
20 Housing and Urban Development be, and they hereby are, assured of
21 full compliance by King County with the regulations of the said
22 Federal department effectuating Title VI of the Civil Rights Act
23 of 1964.

24 8. That the United States of America and the Secretary of
25 Housing and Urban Development be, and they hereby are, assured of
26 full compliance by King County with the Federal labor standards
27 imposed under Title VII of the Housing Act of 1961, as amended.
