A MOTION authorizing the County Executive to execute and submit a grant application to the State Law & Justice Planning Office for funds in the amount of \$103,437 to enable the University of Washington Minority Affairs Office to develop their Prisoner Education Project.

WHEREAS, the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968, as amended, provides for the award of grants by the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration, U.S. Department of Justice, through the Washington State Law & Justice Planning Office; and,

WHEREAS, the County Council recognizes the need to develop rehabilitation and education programs within the criminal justice system; and,

WHEREAS, this grant would help support habilitation reform through the establishment of training programs for ex-offenders; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- 1. That the King County Executive is hereby authorized to make application for funds in the amount of \$103,437 to the State Law & Justice Planning Office on behalf of King County;
- 2. That the County Executive is hereby authorized and directed to file and execute such application and contracts as are required by the State;
- 3. That the King County Law & Justice Planning Office is named the authorized correspondent for King County and is further authorized to furnish such additional information and documents as may be required by the State;
- 4. That the County Executive is also authorized to enter into and execute such subcontracts as are necessary with the University of Washington, Minority Affairs Office, for the implementation of the project.
