A MOTION assigning certain specific tasks to legislative branch offices and staff for 1974.

WHEREAS, the King County Council wishes to have accomplished certain tasks by its offices and staff during the year 1974, and

WHEREAS, the Council wishes to have an official record of these assignments, and

WHEREAS, it has been deemed inappropriate to include such assignments in the expression of legislative intent which is directed primarily toward the executive and judicial branches of government,

NOW THEREFORE, be it moved by the Council of King County:

- That the King County Auditor perform a fiscal and operational audit in 1974 of the Intercounty River activity.
- That the Council Administrator, with cooperation and participation from the Public Works, Budget and Program Planning, and Community Development Departments, conduct a feasibility study of single, county-wide water and sewer, and drainage district, under provisions of state law. This study shall be completed within six months of completion of the RIBCO water basic plan.
- . 3. That the Council Administrator conduct a study, to be completed by May 30, 1974, of the feasibility of a four-day week or other modification of county working hours with the objective of alleviating the energy crisis.
- ... That the Council staff perform cash audits at least annually, of all organizations financed in whole or in part by county funds.
