MOTION NO.

A MOTION relating to Social Security Coverage; requiring certain activities to be accomplished; effecting withdrawal from Social Security; implementing a replacement plan; increasing benefits to individual King County Employees.

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WHEREAS, under the Federal Social Security Act a governing body of a political subdivision which has effected Old Age Survivors Insurance coverage through an agreement which contains a voluntary termination provision, may later terminate coverage of those employees pursuant to the provisions of that agreement, provided that the voluntary termination provision is conditioned (1) That coverage of the employees has been in effect for five years, and (2) That a two-year notice must be given before the termination becomes effective; and

WHEREAS, the same provision is found in the State of Washington, in the statutes of the State of Washington, and in the County of King, State of Washington agreement; and

WHEREAS, Social Security taxes have risen faster than the benefits paid; and

WHEREAS, the <u>Seattle-Post Intelligencer</u>, in special articles from June 9, 1974 through June 13, 1974, critically questioned the worth of Social Security coverage citing startling facts; and

WHEREAS, nationally known writer, William A. Rusher, in the Seattle Post Intelligencer, April 30, 1974, has declared that Social Security is a "regressive payroll tax" which hurts most those least able to pay; and

WHEREAS, no federal employee, nor employee of the Social Security
Administration, is required to expend personal funds, nor participate, in Social Security; and

WHEREAS, the State of Washington is one of only nineteen states which require, by agreement, that public employees pay into and participate in Social Security coverage; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bellevue has exercised its option and withdrawn from Social Security coverage and implemented a

replacement plan; and

WHEREAS, the employees of the City of Bellevue in an employee 3 referendum, by a margin of 87%, voted to withdraw from Social Security coverage; and

WHEREAS, the replacement plan adopted by the City of Bellevue has substantially increased retirement benefits of each individual employee as compared to current benefits now projected for individual 8 King County employees; and

WHEREAS, the investment plan of the City of Bellevue is administered at a substantially lower rate of cost than Social Security; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bellevue's plan allows each employee the option of choice as to whether to participate or not; and, the current agreement between King County and the State of Washington has the affect of requiring participation as a condition of employment; and

WHEREAS, the City of Bellevue's plan, at an identical employee cost to that of Social Security coverage, offers increased retirement benefits and all other Social Security benefits at an identical or more beneficial level; and

WHEREAS, those employees who have worked ten years under Social Security coverage, or anticipate working ten years under Social Security coverage prior to actual retirement, will receive and are qualified for:

- Minimum Social Security Benefits, 1.
- Retirement income from the City of Bellevue, 2.
- Retirement income from the State Retirement System; 3.

WHEREAS, employees of the City of Bellevue have the option of lump sum cash payment or deferred monthly payments at retirement, while Social Security only provides deferred payments; and WHEREAS, the Howard Johnson and Company consulting firm designed

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the replacement plan for the City of Bellevue and performed a study which clearly indicated to each individual employee the vastly improved personal benefits to be achieved by withdrawal from Social Security coverage; and

WHEREAS, the intent of the Council is to seek the best retirement plan for each individual employee in King County government.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- 1. The Council Administrator is directed to expend up to, but not exceeding, \$10,000 from the Council Contingency Fund to complete a study no later than January 30, 1975; PROVIDED THAT, he will evaluate the ability of the County to perform an in-house study, prior to contracting outside County government for the completion of the study; if an outside contract is proposed by the Council Administrator, it shall be approved by the Council.
 - A. The study shall make recommendations as to a replacement plan to current Social Security Coverage;
 - B. The replacement plan shall clearly state that increased benefits to each individual employee of King County government shall result by withdrawal from Social Security coverage and implementation of a replacement plan;
 - C. The increased benefits will be computed at a rate of cost for each employee that is identical to current costs for Social Security coverage;
 - D. The County Executive will make information available to the consulting firm, consistent with statutory requirements, to facilitate completion of the study.
- 2. The Council on or about February 1, 1975, shall approve or disapprove of recommendations proposed by the completed stuć

Should the Council accept the study's recommendations, a 1 referendum by secret ballot of all county employees shall be held 2 to decide whether or not the County shall withdraw from Social 3 Security coverage and implement the designed replacement plan; 4 The referendum will be held on or about March 1, 1975; A. The referendum will be preceded by organized hearings 6 В. designed to inform all employees of the proposed with-7 drawal from Social Security coverage and implementation 8 9 of the replacement plan. 10 Upon approval by the employees of King County to withdraw from Social Security and implement a replacement plan, the 11 Council shall, by motion, notify the Washington State Department 12 of Employment Security that King County is withdrawing from Social 13 Security; PROVIDED THAT, such action shall be performed on or 14 about April 1, 1975 and become effective April 1, 1977. 15 PASSED this 29d day of 16 17 KING COUNTY COUNCIL 18 KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON 19 20 Chairman 21 THOMAS M.
