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17.1.1 MOTION NO.

A MOTION recognizing the 1974 King County Interim Transportation Plan, as a technical document for developing a balanced and integrated transportation system, as an update of and substitute for the 1967 Major Streets and Highways Plan, and to be utilized as an interim plan until the Transportation Element of the Comprehensive Plan is updated and adopted.

WHEREAS, the 1964 Comprehensive Plan for King County, page viii contained the following statement "Some additional detailed studies concerned with individual elements of the plan have been prepared, and it is anticipated that others will follow. Such studies provide working material in greater detail than that contained within this Comprehensive Plan and are utilized by those agencies or persons concerned with the specific subject treated. As such, they are supplementary to the plan itself and may be subject to revision as conditions warrant in conformance with the statement contained herein;" and

WHEREAS, the 1967 Major Streets and Highways Plan was an update of Fig. 3-17 of the 1964 Comprehensive Plan and was utilized for routine zoning, land use and transportation decisions and

WHEREAS, since 1967 many dramatic changes have taken place including:

(a) Sudden changes in population and employment growth pattern;

(b) Recently updated forecasts of population and employment activity;

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(c) Formation of an effective transit system (METRO);

(d) Increase in canceled or indefinitely postponed projects;

29 (e) Advent of the energy crisis and increased environmental 30 awareness;

31 (f) Initiation of the process of updating the 1964 King
32 County Comprehensive Plan; and

(g) Finalization of the update of PSGC's 1990 Transportation

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Plan; and

WHEREAS, these dramatic changes have underscored the need to update the 1967 Major Streets and Highways Plan, and

WHEREAS, the 1974 King County Interim Transportation Plan has been prepared as an update and expansion of the 1967 Major Streets and Highways Plan, and

WHEREAS, in addition to including the streets and highway element of transportation it also addresses the rail, nonmotorized (bicycle, pedestrian, equestrian), aviation and marine elements of transportation.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

(1) The 1974 King County Interim Transportation Plan be recognized as a technical document providing a basis for a new and coordinated look at transportation within King County involving the goal of developing a balanced and integrated transportation system.

(2) The 1974 King County Interim Transportation Plan be recognized as an update of the 1967 Major Streets and Highways Plan and be utilized in place of said document.

(3) The 1974 King County Interim Transportation Plan be utilized unitl the Transportation Element of the Comprehensive Plan is updated and adopted.
