WHEREAS, the 1975 King County Law and Justice Plan and project funding recommended by the King County Law and Justice Planning Committee best meets the needs of King County and participating suburban city governments given the fiscal constraint of the \$956,421 1975 formula allocation,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- 1. The King County Council hereby approves and adopts the 1975 King County Law and Justice Plan and authorizes the County Executive to submit said Plan and to submit formal grant application for all funded King County projects contained therein to the Washington State Office of Community Development, Law and Justice Planning Office.
- 2. Following official notification of grant award and prior to the beginning of planned activities; the Executive shall notify the Chairman of the Operations and Judiciary Committee, in writing, of any substantive changes in the approved

document necessitated by funding source review.

The Operations and Judiciary Committee shall then prepare a motion authorizing said program changes.

3. No funds shall be appropriated for any planned activity unless the proposed appropriation is accompanied by a "Memorandum of Agreement", prepared by the Executive. The "Memorandum of Agreement" shall clearly and concisely state the quantitative objectives of the planned activity. The agreement shall state the means and methods to be used, including time frames, in evaluating the ability of the program sponsor to accomplish stated objectives.
