

MOTION NO. 1800

A MOTION authorizing nine temporary positions  
in the Public Employment Program.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 2112 appropriates \$1,277,100 to the Public  
Employment Program commencing July 1, 1974, through March 31, 1975,  
and

WHEREAS, King County is entitled to receive up to 9 million  
dollars over the next three years under the Housing and Community  
Development Act of 1974, and

WHEREAS, extensive plans and applications must be prepared  
prior to March 1, 1975, and

WHEREAS, funds to prepare these plans have not been provided  
in either the current budget or the 1975 Executive's budget request,  
and

WHEREAS, advance federal monies will not be available to King  
County until January 1975 to accomplish these tasks,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The Executive is authorized and directed to establish the  
following temporary Housing and Community Development positions  
until January 30, 1975 or the receipt of advance federal planning  
monies, whichever date is sooner:

Budget and Program Planning  
Housing and Community Development Act of 1974

1 - Administrative Assistant I  
1 - Office Technician III

Land Use Management

Department of Public Safety

TOTAL POSITIONS = 9

1 Employees hired to fill these positions shall be admini-  
2 stratively transferred from Public Employment Program funded  
3 positions to Community Development Act funded positions, upon  
4 receipt of advance federal planning monies.

5 Personnel hired to fill these positions will be hired in  
6 accordance with all regulations and policies of the Public Employ-  
7 ment Program.

8 No Public Employment funds will be expended to subsidize the  
9 individual salaries of hired personnel in excess of the authorized  
10 monthly rate.

11 In those cases where a position classification represents a  
12 beginning salary level in excess of the authorized monthly rate,  
13 the Executive shall prepare an ordinance appropriating the  
14 necessary funds to reimburse employed individuals for the differ-  
15 ence between their starting salary and maximum salaries allowed  
16 under the Public Employment Program.

17 The Executive and his staff shall prepare, by no later than  
18 November 15, answers, in writing, to the following questions which  
19 shall be reviewed by the Council:

20 1. What procedures will be implemented to provide adequate  
21 and early opportunity for the Council to consider policy decisions  
22 relating to the Housing and Community Development Act, prior to  
23 the formal completion of plans and application for funds?

24 2. By what specific date, prior to the completion of plans  
25 and applications, will the Council consider the policy implication  
26 of proposed County programs or activities which may be phased out  
27 by this ACT? What will be the expected impact? Implication?

28 3. What new authorities are available to urban counties  
29 compared to existing programs and authorities which may be con-  
30 sidered for phasing out?

1 4. Under the Housing and Community Development Act, what  
2 new relationships are possible with special and general units of  
3 government?

4 5. What indicators of community development need will be  
5 developed in completing plans and applications?

6 6. What guidelines will be used in developing community  
7 objectives?

8 7. What methods will be used to prioritize projects?

9 8. What is the advisability of using these funds as match  
10 for other federal monies with no dollar commitment by local  
11 jurisdictions?


12 9. What is the role of the suburban legislative bodies in  
13 the process?

14 10. What are the possible methods of distribution among  
15 jurisdictions?

16 11. How will the requirements of the Housing and Community  
17 Development Act be incorporated into the ongoing planning process  
18 of the County so that activities related to this act are not  
19 treated uniquely in coming years?
