WHEREAS, King County reflects the acute inflation and sion economy, present in the United States having an

A MOTION relating to the County's parti-

recession economy, present in the United States having an unemployment rate in excess of 8%; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of King County to provide public services to alleviate the citizenry's needs of health, welfare, and safety; and

WHEREAS, the County's participation in the CETA program is viewed by the Council as an integral component of providing manpower services to the unemployed in the form of useful and economically productive public employment opportunities; and

WHEREAS, the Council clearly recognizes its legal obligations as the policy determining body of the County; and

WHEREAS, the Council recognizes the legal responsibilities of the Executive to supervise all administrative offices and executive departments established by the Charter or created by the County Council; and

WHEREAS, the County has an obligation to conduct manpower activities in compliance with the rules, regulations, and congressional intent of the Comprehensive Employment And Training Act of 1973; and

WHEREAS, the King-Snohomish Manpower Consortium, of which King County is a member, has defined a goal of filling 80% of the created job opportunities from the "core" population; and

WHEREAS, the "core" population is generally defined as economically and social disadvantaged groups differentiated by age, sex, ethnic groups; and

WHEREAS, the County's CETA program provides for the generation of employment opportunities in County departments, other public agencies, and non-profit corporations providing public sector related services to the general public; and

WHEREAS, the Council is desirous of utilizing CETA funds

to provide the necessary staff to accomplish Council mandated activities as contained in Ordinance 2230;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- 1. The County shall strive for a goal of employing 80% of created employment opportunities from those unemployed individuals meeting core population criteria with special emphasis on developing employment opportunities for eligible clients drawn from the acutely disadvantaged unemployed.
- 2. In all future allocations and CETA programming efforts emphasis shall be placed on:
- a. Developing positions whose employment classifications and job functions will offer direct transitional capability to private sector employment;
- b. Hiring the unemployed who have been directly displaced from the labor force as a result of the recessionary affects of the private sector;
- c. Not creating more than one-third professional positions, as defined in criteria contained in the CETA Act of 1973;

  PROVIDED FURTHER, statistical documentation shall reflect the accomplishment of this policy as applied individually to the three types of organizations funded under the County program;

  County departments, other public agencies and nonprofit corporations.
- 3. The Executive shall submit copies of the monthly and quarterly financial and program progress reports, required by virtue of CETA legislation, to the Operations and Judiciary Committee for review.

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- 4. It shall be the stated policy of the Council that:
- a. Until formal action is taken by this body to accept or modify the Executive's recommendation, the Council does not recognize as binding any previous formal or informal agreement to grant CETA funds or positions to any department; public agency or nonprofit corporation;
- b. The practice of preselecting CETA job applicants, prior to formal release of available employment positions to the media and community based organizations performing manpower intake and referral services, shall not be permitted;
- c. The formula allocation of grant funds between County departments, other public agencies and nonprofit corporations shall be flexible and subject to change with each CETA allocation, grant award; PROVIDED FURTHER, the Council Administrator is directed to prepare for Council consideration, by March 28, 1975, substantive issues and recommendations regarding the formula allocation and specific uses of CETA funds;
- d. The Executive is directed to inform the King-Snohomish Manpower Consortium that the Council will in all cases endeavor to comply with grant preparation time frames; but that, where substantial differences are determined between the Executive's recommendations and the Council's desires, late submission of grant document may result.
- 5. The prime emphasis in developing job opportunities under CETA in County departments will be to fund positions to complete Council mandated functions where manpower is presently not available; PROVIDED FURTHER, the Executive shall ensure that departments have the manpower capability to comply with Council mandated activities in Ordinance 2230, prior to recommending positions for other activities using CETA funds.

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6. The Executive is directed to ensure that the policies inherent in this motion become enforced contract compliance provisions in all agreements involving CETA, participating public and nonprofit agencies.

7. The Council Administrator is charged with the responsibility, to the maximum extent possible under the powers of the Home Rule Charter, to ensure that these policies are adherred to by all parties; PROVIDED FURTHER, he will report to the Council any deviations by parties from these policies and present recommendations to either alter County policy or take corrective action resulting in compliance with the intents of this motion.
