A MOTION activating the inactive King County Noxious Weed Control Board, as provided for in RCW 17.10

WHEREAS, the King County Noxious Weed Control Board was created by the 1969 Washington State Legislature (RCW 17.10.020), and

WHEREAS, the King County Noxious Weed Control Board is inactive until the County Council holds a hearing to determine if there is a damaging infestation of noxious weeds to cause a need to activate said Board (RCW 17.10.040), and

WHEREAS, on September 23, 1974, the Public Works and Transportation Committee of King County held a discussion on the
spreading of the Tansy Ragwort weed in Western Washington which
can cause cirrhosis of the liver and eventual death in animals
which consume it, and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 1975 a hearing was held at which the need to activate said Board was demonstrated;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The King County Noxious Weed Control Board is hereby
established upon the completion of the requirements provided for
in RCW 17.10.040.

The Director of the Department of Public Works and Transportation shall, in cooperation with the Seattle-King County Department of Public Health and the Division of Records and Elections of the Department of Executive Administration, present to the Council and the Executive within four months of the effective date of this motion the following, as provided for in RCW 17.10.050:

(1) Suggested division of the County into five sections to serve as districts from which the five voting members of the King County Noxious Weed Control Board shall be appointed initially by the County Executive and confirmed by the Council as provided for in Sections 340.10 and 340.40 of the King County

Charter.

A list of prospective members, nominated by the King County Council, with supporting qualifications, for each of the five districts, from which the County Executive may choose the five appointments to be confirmed by the Council.

Suggested organizational placement of said Board, start-up and a five year projection of annual operating costs and staff support, in terms of time, number and functional type(s).
