MOTION NO. 4934

A MOTION indicating the Council's approval, subject to conditions, of an unclassified use permit for certain property belonging to H & H SAND AND GRAVEL, INC., designated Land Use Management File No. 125-74-P.

WHEREAS the recommendation of the Zoning and Subdivision Examiner on the application of H & H SAND AND GRAVEL, INC. for an unclassified use permit for a sanitary landfill, Land Use Management File No. 125-74-P, has been appealed; and

WHEREAS the Council has reviewed the record and the written appeal arguments on this matter; and

WHEREAS the Council finds that the reclamation of the subject property by a sanitary landfill operation would make the site more suitable for the uses permitted in the "G" and "S-E" zone classifications; and

WHEREAS the Council finds that a sanitary landfill operation can be conducted at the site in a manner which would not be unreasonably incompatible with the type of uses permitted in the surrounding area; and

WHEREAS the Council finds that the Examiner erred in concluding that the potential detriment to affected properties in the vicinity of the site is greater than the potential benefits to the general public from the proposed sanitary landfill;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The application for an unclassified use permit for a
sanitary landfill petitioned by H & H SAND AND GRAVEL, INC.,
designated Land Use Management File No. 125-74-P, shall be
approved, subject to the following conditions:

- The permit shall be for a period of two years from the date of the ordinance granting the permit;
- 2. Final filled slopes shall not exceed two and one-half

feet horizontal to one foot vertical.

3. Operations at the site, including the operation, maintenance and repair of trucks and equipment, shall be limited to the hours between 8:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M., Monday through Friday, However, the King County Division of Building may authorize operations at other hours and on Saturday and Sunday in order to accommodate specific demolition projects and in order to meet emergencies such as the disposal of material from landslides.

- 4. The interceptor drain around the perimeter of the property shall be protected from erosion by installing such measures as culverts, asphalt lining, etc., where erosive velocities will be exceeded.
- 5. A solid view obscuring buffer shall be provided along the Van Brocklin Road. All natural vegetation presently on the site shall be maintained. Revised landscape plans to illustrate interim and final landscaping shall be provided. These plans shall show final berming and landscaping with more detailed information as to type and mixture of material to be used.
- 6. The maximum lift of fill shall be six to eight feet with eight to twelve inches of clean fill cover on each lift.
- 7. No more than 10,000 square feet of surface area of the fill shall be exposed at any one time. At the end of each day the fill area shall be covered to prevent air-borne material from leaving the site.
- 8. The applicant shall provide signs indicating truck operations, such as "Caution - Truck Crossing". specific character and location of the signs shall be determined by the King County Department of Public A flag shall be affixed to the signs when operations are being conducted at the site and removed when operations are not being conducted. King County Division of Building will require the applicant to provide flagmen when the volume of truck traffic at the site would interfere with the normal traffic flow on Van Brocklin Road. King County Department of Public Works determines that widening of the shoulder of Van Brocklin Road in the vicinity of the exit gate is required in order to accommodate turning and merging movements by trucks leaving the site, the applicant shall provide such shoulder widening.
- 9. The operation shall comply with the "Q-M" operating standards.
- 10. The applicant shall obtain a grading permit yearly

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The applicant shall provide a cash operation bond in 3 the amount of \$1,000.00. 12. The applicant shall post a \$5000 surety bond together with a property lien foreclosure agreement to assure 5 reclamation of the property in accordance with this unclassified use permit or any renewal or extension 6 thereof. 7 Applicant shall maintain a liability policy in the 8 amount of \$100,000.00 per individual, \$300,000.00 per occurrence and \$50,000.00 per property damage and shall name King County as an additional insured. 10 14. Only non-putrescible wastes are to be allowed at the 11 No garbage or other wastes which can cause odors or attract flies or rodents shall be permitted. 12 No chemical wastes shall be allowed, nor shall oil 13 or oil bearing wastes be permitted. 14 Liquid and semi-liquid wastes including, but not 15 limited to, sewage, sewage sludge and various slurries or other similar industrial by-products shall be 16 prohibited. 17 Provisions must be made to direct storm water around 17. the fill area to reduce undesirable leachate as much 18 as possible; and completed sections shall be contoured to divert drainage to the sides and away from the 19 refuse. 20 18. The applicant must agree to treat any undesirable 21 leachate that occurs to render it free from nuisance or objection. 22 19. An attendant must be in charge of the site at all times 23 that it is open to use in order to direct traffic, 24 restrict undesirable wastes, report fires, etc. 25 20. The entire site shall be fenced in accordance with the provisions of King County Ordinance No. 1488. 26 gates shall be provided and shall be locked when operations are not being conducted at the site. 27 21. No burning of any kind shall be conducted at the site. 28 22. Any accidental fires must be immediately controlled 29 by the permit holder; failure to commence controlling 30 a fire within two hours of notification will be considered non-compliance and King County or the 31 local fire districts shall be able to order such steps as are necessary including bulldozers, drag lines, 32 fire trucks, etc. to be employed; the costs of such control to be paid by the permit holder. 33
