

MOTION NO.

A MOTION authorizing application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for funding assistance for Stages II and III of an outdoor recreation project known as Cedar River Regional Park.

WHEREAS, King County, Washington, desires to acquire fee simple title to certain land listed below as authorized by the voters of King County on February 13, 1968, and by King County Resolution #34571, and

WHEREAS, the property is to be held and used permanently as open space land for park and recreational purposes, and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Marine Recreation Land Act and by Referendum 28, a \$40,000,000 Public Recreation Facility Bond authorized by the voters of the State of Washington on November 7, 1972, state and federal funding assistance has been authorized and made available to aid in financing the cost of land for parks and the construction of outdoor recreational facilities of local public bodies, and

WHEREAS, the Council of King County considers it in the best public interest to acquire the park listed below:

PROJECT

ACREAGE

Cedar River Regional Park Approximately 51.52
Stage II and III
Estimated Cost: \$188,231

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

1. The County Executive is hereby authorized to make formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for funding assistance towards the total acquisition of the above mentioned park, and to execute such contracts as are required by said department;

2. This project will be undertaken contingent to the approval of both state and federal agencies for this acquisition;

3. The Intergovernmental Relations Division for King County is hereby designated as the authorized correspondent to provide additional information and to furnish such documents as

may be required by said agency;

4. Any of the aforementioned property acquired with financial aid through the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation is to be placed in use as an outdoor recreation facility and be retained in such use in perpetuity unless otherwise provided and agreed to by the King County Council, the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation, and any affected federal agency; and

5. This motion becomes a part of a formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.
