WHEREAS, The Manpower Development and Training Act of 1962, as amended provides for the award of grants by the United States Department of Labor, and

WHEREAS, The County Council recognizes the need to support employment and training programs for low-income youth residing in King County, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED By the Council of King County:

1. The King County Executive is hereby authorized to make application for funds in the approximate amount of \$1,200,000 to the United States Department of Labor through the King-Snohomish Manpower Consortium on behalf of King County;

2. The King County Executive is hereby authorized and directed to file and execute such applications and contracts as are required by the Department of Labor;

3. ~~The~~ The Federal/State Relations Division is named the authorized correspondent for King County and is further authorized to furnish such additional information and documents as may be required by the State;

4. The County Executive is also authorized to enter into and execute such subcontracts as are necessary for the implementation of the project;

5. The United States of America, Department of Labor, and the State of Washington are hereby assured full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

Re: Proposed Motions relating to the Youth Work Training Program, In-School Summer Program Supplement and Transportation Support

Dear Councilman Reams:

I attach two proposed motions and pre-application proposals regarding the Youth Work Training Program. A pre-application is necessary as the program is based on estimates of the amount of available funds. Final Congressional funding approval is not expected before May 15, 1975.

The Summer program supplement will provide employment to 1,500 youths from mid-June through August in a variety of categories with local government offices, County, municipal, school districts and other qualified public non-profit organizations. This summer will mark the eleventh year that King County has conducted a summer youth employment program through the U.S. Department of Labor funds for manpower services.

The transportation support refers to a service which the employing agency arranges and provides for program participants, whenever necessary, to ensure safe and reasonably convenient mobility to and from the summer work site. Last summer was the first time the Department of Labor released funds for special summer transportation exclusive of the employment program funds. Approximately 1,000 youths will be served by the proposed transportation support program.
