MOTION NO.

A MOTION relating to the County's participation in the CETA program; requesting the Executive to perform certain activities resulting in the promulgation of CETA funded Correction Officer positions in the Department of Rehabilitative Services.

WHEREAS, the Council recognizes its legal obligations as the policy determining body of the County; and

WHEREAS, the Council recognizes the legal responsibilities of the Executive to supervise all administrative offices and executive departments established by the Charter or created by the County Council; and

WHEREAS, the County has an obligation to conduct manpower activities in compliance with the rules, regulations and Congressional intent of the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act of 1973, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Council's intent is to utilize CETA funds, where feasible, to generate career oriented employment positions within King County Government; and

WHEREAS, through the consolidation of the City of Seattle
and King County Jail facilities, substantial numbers of Department
of Public Safety uniformed personnel are performing duty as
Correction Officers in the Department of Rehabilitative Services;
and

WHEREAS, the County's policy has been to transfer uniformed personnel from the Department of Rehabilitative Services to the Department of Public Safety based on the natural attrition of uniformed personnel in the Department of Public Safety, commensurate with the manpower needs of the Department of Rehabilitative Services; and

WHEREAS, the transfer of personnel from the Department of Rehabilitative Services to the Department of Public Safety has resulted in the piecemeal implementation of Correction Officer positions in the Department of Rehabilitative Services; and

WHEREAS, a Correction Officer position is a career oriented position requiring training and technical expertise; and

WHEREAS, the application of CETA funds in creating a substantial number of Correction Officer positions can result in efficient and effective group training of Correction Officers; and

WHEREAS, the use of CETA funds in creating a substantial number of Correction Officer positions can result in a substantial number of uniformed personnel being returned to field duty in the Department of Public Safety; and

WHEREAS, by virtue of adequate planning, uniformed personnel returning to the Department of Public Safety over time will represent no increased current expense liability due to the accuracy of predicted attrition rates of uniformed personnel in the Department of Public Safety; and

WHEREAS, Department of Public Safety officials are predicting currently an attrition rate of 1.5 uniformed personnel, per month, retiring or leaving the Department of Public Safety; and

WHEREAS, the concept of creating and hiring a substantial number of Correction Officers, resulting in the transfer of uniformed personnel to field duty in the Department of Public Safety, is the very essence of the CETA Act, that being the creation of meaningful employment positions that can result in careers in public service,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The Executive is requested to present a proposal for the use of CETA funds to the Council at the earliest possible date, as an operating budget priority, that will result in the implementation of, at least, eighteen Correction Officer positions in the Department of Rehabilitative Services. The Executive, at a minimum, will insure that in the proposal:

1. The procedures for hiring will include the direct

involvement of Department of Rehabilitative Services in the screening, testing and selection of CETA qualified applicants to fill created positions.

- 2. The plan contains adequate provisions for training CETA hirees as a group, as evidenced by defined training objectives and a stated date by which training phases will be completed.
- 3. The plan clearly states a date by which CETA funded Correction Officers shall report for duty; and, on that day, an equal number of uniformed personnel now performing duty in the jail under the Department of Rehabilitative Services shall report to the Department of Public Safety for assignment.
