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A MOTION adopting the 1976 King County Law and Justice Plan, and authorizing the County Executive to submit the Plan and formal grant applications for all 1976 King County projects contained therein to the Washington State Office of Community Development, Law and Justice Planning Office.

MOTION NO.

WHEREAS, the State of Washington's Law and Justice Planning Office and the Governor's Committee on Law and Justice require that a regional plan be prepared and adopted by King County as a condition for King County's eligibility for the receipt of block grant funds made available to local governments under the provisions of the Crime Control Act of 1973, and,

WHEREAS, the State Committee on Law and Justice has allocated 1976 Part "C" block grant funds to local regions on the basis of a formula and in doing so has required the preparation of regional plans whose combined project costs do not exceed the region's formula allocation, and,

WHEREAS, the 1976 King County Law and Justice Plan and project funding recommended by the King County Law and Justice Planning Committee best meets the needs of King County and participating suburban city governments given the fiscal constraint of an estimated \$956,000 1976 formula allocation,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- 1. The King County Council hereby approves and adopts the 1976 King County Law and Justice Plan and authorizes the County Executive to submit said Plan and to submit formal grant application for all King County projects contained therein to the Washington State Office of Community Development, Law and Justice Planning Office.
- 2. Following official notification of grant award and prior to the beginning of planned activities, the Executive shall notify the Chairman of the Operations, Police and Judiciary Committee, in writing, of any substantive changes in the approved document necessitated by funding

source review. The Operations, Police and Judiciary Committee shall then prepare a motion authorizing said program changes. No funds shall be appropriated for any planned 3. activity unless the proposed appropriation is accompanied by a letter from the Executive. The letter shall clearly and concisely state the objectives of the planned activity. The letter shall state the means and methods to be used, .9 including time frames, in evaluating the ability of the program operator to accomplish stated objectives.
