A MOTION relating to the development of criteria and designation of urban, suburban, and rural service districts in King County.

WHEREAS, while King County is an urban county, it is benefited by diverse urban, suburban, and rural communities, and WHEREAS, the subcounty areas in unincorporated King County vary from the urbanized areas close to Puget Sound to the undeveloped rural areas of the North Central Cascades, and

WHEREAS, these distinct subcounty areas and communities are best served by county regulations and policies which reflect their diverse needs and characteristics, and

WHEREAS, it has been the long standing policy of the King County Council to recognize the unique characteristics and needs of the urban, suburban, and rural areas of the county in county programs, and

WHEREAS, if King County wishes to continue its recognition of the unique qualities of subcounty areas by applying ordinances differentially to these areas it must develop substantial justification for doing so, and

WHEREAS, the recommendations of the Metropolitan Study
Commission include establishment of rural and urban service
districts which would reflect the diverse types of communities
within King County, and

WHEREAS, the Council of King County recognizes the value of enhancing a variety of land use development patterns within the county while encouraging orderly development and the coordination of residential and employment centers,
