A MOTION relating to the development of a policy and programs for the protection of agricultural lands in King County.

WHEREAS, King County is a rural and urban county with over sixty thousand acres of agricultural land, and

WHEREAS, King County adopted by Ordinance 1096 on January 10, 1972, the "Open Space Element of the Comprehensive Plan" which included goals and policies applying to the county's agricultural lands, and

WHEREAS, the agricultural lands policies adopted in Ordinance 1096 apply to all unincorporated lands in the county and state that: "Class II and III soils having agricultural potential and other classified or unclassified land presently being farmed shall be reserved for current and anticipated needs", and

WHEREAS, King County adopted by Ordinance 1839 on November 3, 1973, an "Addendum to the Open Space Element of the Comprehensive Plan" which included goals and policies applying to the county's agricultural lands, and

WHEREAS, the agricultural lands policies adopted in Ordinance 1839 apply only to land east of and including Range 6 and state that: "all individual parcels of agricultural land having class II and/or class III soils that collectively comprise a contiguous area of 160 or more acres" shall be preserved in open space uses, and

WHEREAS, a definitive county policy regarding the retention of the county's agricultural lands west of and including Range 5 does not currently exist due to the fact that the amended open space policies of Ordinance 1839 do not apply to these lands, and

WHEREAS, the continuing growth and urbanization of the area west of and including Range 5 will place increasing development pressures upon existing agricultural lands for conversion from agricultural uses, and

WHEREAS, King County has recognized the unique value of agricultural lands through the King County Zoning Code which states: "well located and well composed agricultural land is a major natural resource that cannot be made nor increased and that...it is deemed essential to preserve the irreplaceable agricultural lands as far as is reasonable and encourage its use for agriculture", and

WHEREAS, the King County Zoning Code also states that the purpose of the agricultural zone designation and its application is to encourage the protection of agricultural lands "by discouraging the encroachment of urban type development by establishing a high minimum area standard and permitting only such uses as relate to agricultural production or are similar thereto", and

WHEREAS, the Council Committee on Planning and Community Development has considered the matter of agricultural land policies for the county agricultural lands located west of and including Range 6 and has requested that further study be given to the development of these policies,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- I. In order to develop policies and/or programs relating to all agricultural lands of King County including, but not limited to, agricultural lands west of Range 6, the Department of Planning and Community Development and the Council Administrator are requested to complete certain tasks, as specified below:
- II. The Department of Planning and Community Development is requested to complete the following:
- A. Assess and inventory current agricultural land resources and activities in King County, examine recent trends in agricultural land uses in the county, and assess future demands for uses of existing agricultural land within King County.
