A MOTION authorizing the County Executive to execute and submit a grant application to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for Comprehensive Planning Assistance (701) Funds, County file No. 603.

WHEREAS, King County has been declared eligible to apply for HUD Comprehensive Planning Assistance (701) when it achieved "Urban County" status under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, and

WHEREAS, HUD has set aside \$75,000 for King County if an acceptable application is submitted by the County, and

WHEREAS, the types of eligible activities fit within County needs, and WHEREAS, the funds will be used to support the development of the activities shown in the attachment to this motion.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- 1. The King County Executive is hereby authorized to make application for funds in the amount of \$75,000 to the Department of Housing and Urban Development on behalf of King County;
- The King County Executive is hereby authorized and directed to file and execute such applications and contracts as are required by the Department of Housing and Urban Development;
- 3. The United States of America is hereby assured full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

- (1) Planning Management & Decision-Making Systems: This category includes developing an internal operating manual and reporting procedures for the Division of Planning, compiling all land use policies and regulations into a single format, and developing revised procedures for the housing and community development block grant. Most of this work will be accomplished in the first year and a small portion finally completed in the second year.
- (2) Land Resource Management: This category includes development of an Agricultural Preservation and Support Program, a Minerals Extraction Policy, participation in the RDP process and application of growth policies to the County with specific emphasis on urban redevelopment, "skipped over" areas, and utilities. This work begins in the current grant year and carries into the second.
- (3) Housing: This provides for building from the existing base of Ordinance 2555, maximizing opportunities for low-income minority and disadvantaged persons, identifying locations where housing needs are greatest, and developing policies and programs to meet the needs. Most of this work will be accomplished in the first year of the grant.
- (4) Grant Administration: This category covers federal coordination and reporting requirements mandated by grant acceptance.
