A MOTION allocating King County's 1976 Community Development Block Grant "population" funds and forwarding projects to the Joint Policy Committee to be considered for "County-wide needs" and "discretionary" funds.

WHEREAS, King County, twenty-six suburban cities and the Muckleshoot Indian Tribe, as an "urban County" consortium, will receive \$3,340,000 of Community Development Block Grant funds by July, 1976, for the 1976 - 77 funding year, and

WHEREAS, the King County Council's priorities for \$1,191,720 in "population" funds, \$953,376 in "Countywide needs" funds, and \$450,708 in "discretionary" funds will be established by this Motion, and

WHEREAS, there has been significant citizen involvement in developing this proposed 1976 Community Development Program, and

WHEREAS, this program is consistent with the Community Development "Proposal Guides" adopted by the Council,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County: The projects in the funding categories and amounts specified on the attached list are adopted as King County's 1976 - 77 Community Development Program, provided that:
