A MOTION recognizing the submission of a grant application to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development for funds in the amount of \$95,196. to support the King County Work Measurement Program.

WHEREAS, the Department of Housing and Urban Development has established an Innovative Projects Program providing for the award of grants for community development projects, and

WHEREAS, the Executive desires to expand the Work Measurement
Program in order to increase productivity and achieve savings, and
WHEREAS, the Executive submitted a grant application for
funds to support an expanded Work Measurement Program without the
approval by the Council to submit said proposal, and

WHEREAS, the approval of a motion to submit the grant application, after the grant application has been physically forwarded to the funding source, would be meaningless as a statement of Council policy, and

WHEREAS, the Council in its deliberations of the County's 1976 budget, Ordinance No. 2544, raised many questions and concerns regarding the performance of the Productivity Task Force, and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 2544 provided six months funding for the
Productivity Task Force with the Council intent that no further
funds would be appropriated without Council approval, following
the Executive's proposing a plan for maintaining productivity
standards, and

WHEREAS, it was also the Council's intent that the Executive's proposed plan would include a recommended organization plan and a funding level for the period July 1, 1976 through December 31, 1976, and

WHEREAS, the Council has no information pertaining to the first six months' performance of the Productivity Task Force; performance in terms of savings achieved and productivity increased and
