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BILL REAMS Introduced by: 1 1 1 1 1 1 1 MOTION NO. 1 76 - 200 1 A MOTION authorizing the County Executive 2 to enter into a contract with the Washington State Department of Social and Health Services 3 providing for County participation in the Rebellious Youth Project for a second year of operation. 5 WHEREAS, it is desirable to develop alternatives to detention 6 for dependent/rebellious youth, and 7 WHEREAS, the Rebellious Youth Project might indirectly 8 increase the availability of services that provide such an 9 alternative, 10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County: 11 The Council hereby authorizes the County Executive to enter 12 into a contract with Washington State Department of Social and 13 Health Services which provides for partial County funding of the 14 Rebellious Youth Project for a second year of operation in the 15 amount of \$15,810 provided the contract contains the following 16 conditions: 17 DSHS recognizes that it has a statutory obligation to 1. 18 provide the direct services that are needed as an alternative to 19 detention for rebellious youth. These services include counseling 20 aimed at keeping youth in their homes or reuniting them with 21 their families, providing appropriate out-of-home placement 22 when necessary and coordinating these services; 23 2. The primary goal of the Rebellious Youth Project is to 24 reduce the population of rebellious youth admitted to detention 25 and evaluations will measure performance in achieving that goal; 26 The Rebellious Youth Project will not solicit County 3. 27 funding beyond the second year of operation; if the project 28 continues past the second year it will be funded solely by DSHS; 29 The County will not be requested to fund any direct 4. 30 services that are developed as a result of the project; 31 32

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5. The county will not be requested to fund any community services coordination or client referral and follow-up services developed as a result of this project;

6. Subject to evaluation of their effectiveness, continuation of any services or processes developed by this project for the Juvenile Court detention screening process shall be the purview and responsibility of the Department of Juvenile services;

7. The Department of Juvenile Services, the Department of Budget and Program Development, and the King County Council will be regularly informed of project activities through quarterly progress reports and will have access to all project data;

8. The project, using the funds budgeted for research and evaluation, will perform an evaluation by the end of the first six months of the second year.

9. The project director shall be required to meet periodically in the project target areas with invitations to all other agencies currently dealing with services for this group of youth.
