MOTION NO. _____

A MOTION setting forth target dates for development of additional regulations for inclusion in the noise control ordinance.

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the City of Seattle and King County to control noise with the adoption of ordinances regulating noise sources; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent that the Seattle-King County Department of Public Health be the primary agency, regulating noise pollution, and

WHEREAS, the proposed noise ordinances direct the Seattle-King County Department of Public Health to develop proposed amendments to the noise ordinance, and

WHEREAS, these proposed amendments are to be brought to the Council for adoption to regulate sources of noise not yet regulated by the ordinance.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

That the Seattle-King County Department of Public Health, taking into consideration criteria such as staff limitations, timing of anticipated promulgation of similar regulations by other federal and state governments, and local noise problems, will develop proposed amendments for the following noise sources, adhering where possible to the following target dates:


<u>Due Date</u>	<u>Noise Ordinance Provision</u>
April, 1977	1. Sounds created by motor vehicle racing events.
July, 1977	2. Sounds created by float planes.
July, 1977	3. Sounds created by land based planes.
July, 1977	4. Sounds created by construction equipment including special construction vehicles.
July, 1977	5. Sounds created by watercraft.
January, 1978	6. Sounds created by the operation of equipment or facilities or surface carriers engaged in commerce by railroad.
January, 1978	7. Sounds created by off-highway motor vehicles, motor vehicles when operated off public roads or highways, and motorcycles.


<u>Due Date</u>	<u>Noise Ordinance Provision</u>
July, 1978	8. Sounds created by aircraft testing and maintenance.
July, 1978	9. Sounds created by the installation or repair of essential utilities.
July, 1978	10. Sounds created by maintenance operations of public facilities.
January, 1979	11. Sounds created by powered equipment used in temporary or periodic maintenance repair of residential properties.
January, 1979	12. Vibrations.
