WHEREAS, the Municipality of Metropolitan Seattle provides sewerage and mass transit services in King County, and

A MOTION supporting the merger of King County and

WHEREAS, the provision of these services have a significant effect on land use planning and development in King County, and

WHEREAS, the boundaries of King County and Metro are coterminous, and WHEREAS, the Municipality of Metropolitan Seattle is authorized under state law to provide additional functions that could directly affect countywide comprehensive planning, and

WHEREAS, the two governments sometimes exercise conflicting roles in land use planning and development which may have adverse effects on such policies as preservation of agricultural land, and

WHEREAS, such services should be performed by a single governmental entity managed by officials directly elected by the people on a one person one vote basis, and

WHEREAS, many elected officials of King County and cities within the county have indicated in principle their support for consolidating Metro and King County government, and

WHEREAS, members of the Washington State Legislature have demonstrated leadership to achieve such consolidation and representation through the introduction of Senate Bill 2430 to enable the merger to take place, and

WHEREAS, that leadership by members of the Washington State Legislature, and particularly the sponsors of Senate Bill 2430, have provided the best opportunity we in local government in King County have ever had to accomplish the long delayed and much talked about goal of consolidating Metro and King County government, and

WHEREAS, merger of Metro with King County requires both full discussion by the people of King County and the broad based support of their elected officials, and

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WHEREAS, sufficient time must be allowed before State enabling legislation takes effect to ensure that the County Council can give proper consideration to the recommendations of both the Charter Review Committee and these elected officials, and

WHEREAS, the enactment of State enabling legislation is a necessary step to achieve the consolidation of Metro and King County, and

WHEREAS, a twenty member Charter Review Committee is presently meeting to consider needed amendments to the County Home Rule Charter and plans to develop and propose amendments which will facilitate such consolidation, including modification in the size of the County Council,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The King County Council hereby declares its support for the merger of the Municipality of Metropolitan Seattle with King County and further supports actions required to allow for a public vote on merger to occur not earlier than November, 1978.

BE IT FURTHER MOVED by the Council of King County:

Recognizing the need for State enabling legislation to effectuate a merger of the Municipality of Metropolitan Seattle with King County, any state legislation to allow merger should provide that:

- 1. The assumption of responsibility by King County of METRO functions shall be based upon a vote of the people of King County, and
- 2. To ensure that the time table contained herein can be followed, the effective date of any enabling legislation should be not earlier than July, 1978, and
  - 3. Until the effective date of the enabling legislation:
- a. Where a local government has established a comprehensive plan or program for the preservation or protection of shorelines, wildlife refuges, wilderness areas, wetlands, agricultural lands, or for the growth and development of industrial, commercial and residential activities, the local legislative body shall review the plans, programs, policies, and budgets of the Municipality of Metropolitan Seattle for consistency with comprehensive plans and programs which relate to that jurisdiction.

b. Upon finding that the Municipality of Metropolitan Seattle plans, programs, policies and budgets for that jurisdiction are not consistent with local government policy and plans, the local legislative body may propose amendments to the plans, programs, policies and budget of the Municipality of Metropolitan Seattle to ensure consistency PROVIDED THAT, no amendment to the budget shall adversely affect the Municipality's ability to meet its current and outstanding bond financing obligations.

c. Said amendments by a local legislative body and the reasons therefor shall be deemed incorporated unless rescinded by a two thirds vote of the Metropolitan Council.

BE IT FURTHER MOVED by the Council of King County:

Recognizing that the successful merger of the Municipality of
Metropolitan Seattle with King County may require an expanded County
legislative body to replace the Metro and King County Councils thereby
ensuring direct and equal representation of all the citizens of the County,
the Charter Review Committee is hereby requested to consider, as a part of
its work effort, the structure of the legislative body for a merged
County/Metro government and submit the necessary Charter amendments to
accomplish said structure to the Council in time to be included in the
public vote on merger. The Chairman of the County Council is requested
to work with the Charter Review Committee, the County Executive, and the
other entities of local government to develop a program by which the
entire community will participate in the development of the merger.
