

SUBSTITUTE
MOTION NO. 3045

A MOTION relating to the Housing and Community Development Block Grant, ratifying actions of the Joint Policy Committee, and authorizing the County Executive to submit revisions to previous Grant Applications to the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

WHEREAS, Public Law 93-383 establishes a program of financial assistance to local governments for the development of viable urban communities through the provision of decent housing and a suitable living environment and expanded economic opportunities, primarily for persons of low and moderate income, and

WHEREAS, King County qualifies as an "urban county" under the provisions of the Act, and

WHEREAS, King County is in a Consortium with 26 cities and towns and the Muckleshoot Indian Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the County Council, the governing bodies of the other consortium members, and the Joint Policy Committee have reviewed proposed programs and projects pursuant to the Consortium Cooperation Agreement, and

WHEREAS, \$122,163 allocated for Block Grant projects in previous years has become available for reallocation, and

WHEREAS, \$35,012 in City Population funds for the 1977 - 78 program year are ready for allocation, and

WHEREAS, the Council finds the projects and programs on the attached list and amendatory documents to be eligible in accordance with federal laws and regulations, and

WHEREAS, the Council has held public hearings to hear the views of citizens on housing and community development needs;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

1. The Council of King County finds and determines that the projects and programs for which funds will be used have been developed to give maximum feasible priority to activities which will benefit low and moderate income families, to aid in the

1 prevention and elimination of slums and blight, or to meet urgent
2 community development needs;

3 2. The King County Executive is hereby authorized to file
4 and execute the attached and other amendatory documents as
5 should be required by the grantor; PROVIDED THAT, the King County
6 Minor Home Repair program and the Energy Conservation Program
7 shall not be implemented until such times as CETA funds are
8 awarded to them and an appropriation is made to fund the Local
9 Capacity Building/Planning Assistance Program as established by
10 Motion 3003. PROVIDED FURTHER THAT, the proposed work program
11 for the Land Use Inventory/Vacant Lands Study, as attached to
12 Motion 2982, shall be reviewed and developed as a joint project
13 with the suburban cities and towns of King County and the
14 Subregional Council of PSCOG.

15 3. The King County Executive is also authorized to enter
16 into and execute such subcontracts as are necessary for the
17 implementation of the projects;

18 4. The Department of Housing and Urban Development is
19 hereby assured full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights
20 Act.

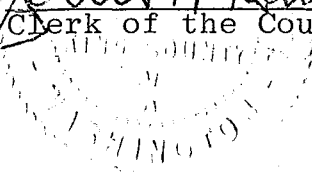
