A MOTION recognizing the Burien Area Transportation Study (BATS) Report as the technical document providing the transportation element of the Highline Communities Plan and establishing a documented prototype community transportation planning study procedure which incorporates the use of a micro-modeling computer travel forecasting model.

WHEREAS, the County of King is engaged in and responsible for multimodal transportation planning to meet the mobility needs of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the County of King currently prepares "community plans," which include a transportation element, and are adopted as amendments to the adopted King County Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, Motion No. 1744, on September 9, 1974, recognized the King County Interim Transportation Plan as a replacement for the 1967 Streets and Highways Plan, a technical document providing a basis for a new and coordinated look at transportation, and as a document to be used until the Transportation Element of the Comprehensive Plan is updated and adopted; and

WHEREAS, the County Council recognized and directed that the Policy Development Commission's Report on Transportation Goals, Objectives and Policies be prepared to become a part of the County's Comprehensive Plan by adopting Motion 2592 on July 12, 1976, which had as its overall Transportation goal to "encourage the development of a balanced and integrated transportation system which can be operated and maintained to provide the optimum transportation services to all users, while supporting the social, economic, environmental, governmental and land use goals of the citizens of King County", and

WHEREAS, Motion 2314, on February 17, 1976, recognized the King County Bicycle Plan Focus 1990 as a technical document for the planning and development of a bicycle system as a part of the non-motorized element of the transportation plan and system for unincorporated King County, and

WHEREAS, the King County Bicycle Plan Focus 1990 included the Policy Development Commission's Report on Goals, Objectives and Policies for Bicycle Facilities in King County which was adopted separately by Motion 2825 in December 12, 1976 and intended to become a part of the County Comprehensive Plan, which has as its one overall goal that "safe, pleasurable bicycle facilities should be made available to all King County residents," and

WHEREAS, the County Council declared its policy support of the development and use of energy efficient transportation systems by Motion 2787 on December 6, 1976 which adopted the Policy Development Commission's Report on Energy Conservation Policies for King County and intended that it become a part of the County's Comprehensive Plan, and

WHEREAS, King County is responsible for local contributions in the development of a Regional Transportation Plan which includes the Long Range Element and the Transportation System Element (TSM), and ultimately results in a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for the region.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- (1) The Burien Area Transportation Study (BATS) be recognized as the technical document providing the transportation element of the Highline Communities Plan, and
- (2) The BATS report establishes the prototype procedure for community transportation studies incorporating the use of micro-model computer travel forecasting capabilities, where appropriate, and
- (3) The BATS report provides the technical basis for the refinement of existing regional or countywide transportation plans within the Burien study area.
