2 A MOTION authorizing the County Executive
3 to make a grant application for funds in
4 an approximate amount of \$40,000 to
5 support a County-unified weatherization
6 program, and to authorize the executive
7 to sign memorandums of agreement with
8 local governments and private non-profit
9 organizations to receive funds to support
10 the County's unified weatherization
11 program.

12 WHEREAS, the Federal Energy Administration and the Community Service
13 Administration are empowered to make grants to support weatherization
14 programs operated by local units of government, and

15 WHEREAS, the state of Washington, in its role as the Planning Agency
16 for the weatherization funds, has determined that 37% of the funds coming
17 into King County will serve residents in the King County outside of the city
18 of Seattle, and

19 WHEREAS, the Executive intends to contract with the Housing Authority of
20 King County to carry out a unified weatherization program in those areas of
21 the County where the Housing Authority is authorized to operate, and

22 WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of King County is authorized to spend
23 \$57,576 for CETA workers to carry out a unified weatherization program, and

24 WHEREAS, \$25,000 in joint Community Development Block Grant funds have
25 been appropriated to carry out a unified weatherization program, and

26 WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2988 authorized the Executive to contract with
27 the Housing Authority to carry out a current expense-funded weatherization
28 program for \$45,000, and

29 WHEREAS, Community Service Administration grants have been provided to
30 the city of Seattle and to private non-profit organizations to carry out a
31 weatherization program, and

32 WHEREAS, the city of Seattle and private non-profit organizations are
33 willing to enter into agreements with the County to provide funds in support
of the County's unified weatherization program, and

WHEREAS, it is the policy of King County to pursue and make available to
homeowners of King County, all available funds for weatherization, and

1 WHEREAS, the Council of King County finds that provisions of such
2 services is in the public interest.

3 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

4 1. The King County Executive is authorized to make application for
5 funds in the approximate amount of \$40,000 to the Federal Energy Administration
6 to support the County's unified weatherization program.

7 2. The King County Executive is hereby authorized to file and
8 execute such application and enter into and execute such contracts as are
9 required in order to carry out a unified weatherization program.

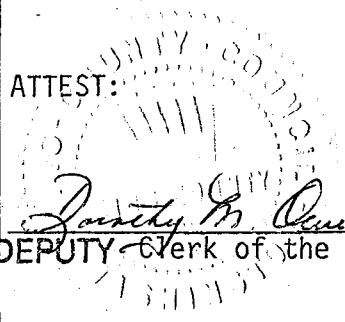
10 3. The King County Executive is authorized to enter into memorandums
11 of agreement with private/nonprofit organizations and the city of Seattle in
12 order to receive funds to carry out a unified weatherization program.

13 4. The Federal Energy Administration and the Community Service
14 Administration is hereby assured full compliance with Title VI of the Civil
15 Rights Act.
