A MOTION urging the voters of Shoreline School District to support the 2.5 million dollar bond issue for capital improvements by voting yes on the proposition, November 8, 1977, General Election Day.

WHEREAS, the current capital budget fund for Shoreline School District is only 25,000 dollars, and

WHEREAS, to make necessary improvements to the existing educational facilities an additional 2.5 million dollars is needed, and

WHEREAS, the King County Council recognizes that to implement necessary improvements it is necessary for the Shoreline School district to incur a general indebtedness by issuing its general obligation bonds in the principal amount of 2.5 million dollars, and

WHEREAS, the laws of the State of Washington require that incurring such indebtedness and issuing the resultant bonds is an issue which must be considered and ratified by the people of the Shoreline School District, and

WHEREAS, the Shoreline School Board by Resolution 446 authorized a School Facilities Improvement Bond in the amount of 2.5 million dollars, passed unanimously September 22, 1977, authorizing the placing of the bond on the ballot of the General Election to be held November 8, 1977.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The Council encourages the Shoreline School District Voters to support needed capital improvements in the Shoreline School system by voting affirmatively to the 2.5. million dollar general obligation bond issue November 8, 1977, General Election Day.
