MOTION NO. 03275

A MOTION declaring King County's policy pertaining to on-site waste water disposal systems and establishing a work program to implement this policy.

WHEREAS, many of the citizens of King County have indicated their desire to maintain the rural character of portions of the County; and

WHEREAS, the rural character of some areas of the County can be destroyed through the provision of sewers which require high density urban development to be financially feasible; and

WHEREAS, in order to maintain the rural nature of the County, alternatives to sewers which can provide a long-term solution to sewage disposal must be accepted and utilized in the County; and

WHEREAS, through a series of actions, King County is developing a growth management program which will coordinate the extension of sewer services with land use decisions; and

WHEREAS, these actions are based upon a goal of avoiding unnecessary public costs associated with urban development and of maintaining the viability of the existing cities and towns of King County; and

WHEREAS, a May 1977 METRO study on sewage disposal alternatives concluded that many of the septic tank failures in King County and related health problems are caused by improper maintenance and installation; and

WHEREAS, the consideration of on-site systems as long-term solutions for sewage disposal will require revisions in the design standards for septic tanks and other similar systems; and

WHEREAS, in situations where on-site systems involve common facilities shared by more than one household, the management of such systems may require public agency involvement.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

To the fullest extent possible, consistent with national

goals for water quality, the King County Council hereby declares a policy that in rural areas of King County, on-site methods of sewage disposal shall be the preferred method of waste water disposal.

- In order to implement the policy stated in #1 above, the following actions are requested:
- The King County Board of Health shall present to the Council proposed revisions to the King County Rules & Regulations Relating to On-Site Sewage Disposal Systems, which revisions shall include but not be limited to the following:
- Modified design standards and related criteria for on-site systems which shall be a long-term method of sewage disposal.
- (2) Provisions setting forth an inspection and maintenance program for individual household on-site sewage disposal systems.
- B. The County Executive shall present to the Council recommendations relating to County assumption of management responsibilities for common sewage disposal facilities which involve more than one household. These recommendations shall provide the necessary draft ordinances or regulations and cost estimates for the implementation of a County management program.
- The actions requested in 2A and 2B above shall be completed prior to June 1, 1978.
