MOTION NO. C3506

A MOTION whereby the King County Council agrees in concept, to a cooperative effort with School Districts to provide additional and improved athletic facilities and to joint ventures with the cities of King County, to meet the park and recreation facility needs of King County residents in unincorporated areas

WHEREAS, the demands for athletic facilities for soccer, softball, baseball and football have increased substantially in recent years, and

WHEREAS, existing County facilities are inadequate to meet the current and future needs of King County residents, and

WHEREAS, the population and development characteristics of much of that portion of King County which holds most of the population is at an urban density greater than or equal to cities in King County with the exception of Seattle, and

WHEREAS, the School Districts in King County own and operate the majority of developed and undeveloped athletic facilities, and

WHEREAS, the public interest would be served by maximizing the use of developed and available school properties, and

WHEREAS, the improvement of certain school sites would help meet demand, and

WHEREAS, the potential exists for Joint Capital Development and maintenance of select school sites, and

WHEREAS, the King County Park Policy Task Force established by Council Motion 2126 recommends this cooperative effort between the County and School Districts, and

WHEREAS, the service areas of certain park and recreation facilities include both incorporated cities and unincorporated King County, and

WHEREAS, King County has developed policies to guide the level of park and recreation services in unincorporated King County, and

WHEREAS, the cooperative acquisition, development and

maintenance of park and recreation facilities with cities may be economically beneficial and improve the level of service to unincorporated King County;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- The King County Division of Parks will pursue the concept of cooperative development of athletic facilities with School Districts.
- The King County Division of Parks will, where appropriate and within funding limitations, maintain athletic facilities on School District properties when such maintenance will increase the use and availability of facilities for the residents of King County.
- The King County Division of Parks will pursue with the cities of King County the concept of cooperative acquisition, development and maintenance of park and recreation facilities where the residents of unincorporated King County will be best served by such cooperation
- 4. The King County Division of Parks will incorporate specific development proposals into their Capital Improvement Programs as funds become available for their completion.
