MOTION NO. 3527

A MOTION whereby the King County Council establishes targets, based on population, for the provision of athletic facilities to meet the needs of King County residents in unincorporated areas.

WHEREAS, the residents of unincorporated King County look to the County for the provision of local government services, and

WHEREAS, the population and development characteristics of much of that portion of King County which holds most of the population is at an urban density greater than or equal to cities in King County with the exception of Seattle, and

WHEREAS, the demands for athletic facilities for soccer, tennis, softball, baseball and football have increased substantially in recent years, and

WHEREAS, no specific standards exist to insure the equitable distribution of facilities, and

WHEREAS, the King County Policy Task Force established by Council Motion 2426 has recommended that the County move towards a uniform policy for the provision of athletic facilities

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

1. King County establishes targets based on population, for the distribution of athletic facilities in unincorporated King County. These targets to serve as long range guidelines for the future development of county programs and facilities as resources become available. Targets will be adjusted according to population characteristics at the time of implementation. The targets, which include school district facilities, are as follows:

These standards are not intended to disrupt the planning and location of athletic facilities which are currently being proposed by King County, or jointly proposed by King County and other suburban municipalities and other jurisdictions for the provision of different types of athletic facilities within a given site.
