With the exception of additional conditions 19, 20, and 21, set forth below:

This motion does hereby adopt and incorporate herein as its own findings and conclusions the findings and conclusions contained in the report of the Zoning and Subdivision Examiner dated April 27, 1978 which was filed with the Clerk of the Council on May 12, 1978, regarding the Preliminary Plat of REINWOOD DIVISION 2 designated by the Building and Land Development Division, Department of Planning and Community Development File No. 877-6A, and the Council does concur with the recommendations contained in said report with the following added conditions:

Condition No. 19: Construction of NE 180th Street shall be withheld until such time as the property to the north of Reinwood Division 2 has been analyzed to determine the best location (if any) for a second access to the Woodinville-Duvall Road.

Condition No. 20: Right-of-way shall be reserved along the west edge of Lot No. 1 for a future connection to NE 171st Street. Construction to occur at a later date, when the actual connection to NE 171st Street becomes eminent.

Condition No. 21: A right turn-in only will be allowed from Woodinville-Duvall Road to Tract "D." (The B-C zoned tract in the southwest corner of the plat) Ingress and egress from 143rd Place NE to Tract "D" will be allowed.
