A MOTION whereby the King County Council agrees, in concept, to revise existing contracts between King County Parks Division and those suburban cities that provide recreation services to residents of unincorporated King County who reside within the service area of that city.

WHEREAS, the format for the contractual agreements between King County and the Cities of Redmond, Kirkland, Kent, Auburn and Issaquah have not been revised since 1973, and

WHEREAS, the suburban cities are requesting revision of these contracts, and

WHEREAS, conditions have changed in many service areas which impact the demand for and delivery of recreational services, e.g., population and annexation, and

WHEREAS, King County finds that the continuation of these contracts is a reasonable and efficient way to deliver recreation service, and

WHEREAS, King County has defined a level of recreation service it will attempt to provide, and

WHEREAS, the King County Park Policy Task Force established by Council Motion 2126 recommends the revision of the contracts with suburban cities;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

1. It is the intent of the County Council to revise the contracts with suburban cities for the year 1979.

2. The revised contracts are to be based on a formula as follows: the per capita amount which King County Division of Parks presently spends in the direct delivery of recreation services in areas of similar characteristics multiplied by the number of residents of unincorporated King County within the service area of the contract city (usually the School District Boundary).
