MOTION NO. 3585

A MOTION authorizing the County Executive to make application for funding assistance for an outdoor recreation project, North Des Moines Beach Park, to the interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation as provided by the Marine Recreation Land Act.

WHEREAS, the Council of King County has approved a "Comprehensive Park and Recreation Plan" for the County which identifies a saltwater park in the Highline area of King County as a priority, and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Marine Recreation Land Act, State and Federal funding assistance has been authorized and made available to aid in financing the cost of land for parks and the construction of outdoor recreational facilities of local public bodies, and

WHEREAS, the King County Council considers it is in the best public interest to acquire North Des Moines Beach Park, a saltwater park in the Highline area of King County.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

1. The County Executive is hereby authorized to make formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for funding assistance for North Des Moines Beach Park.

2. Any funding assistance received will be used in the acquisition of fifteen (15.) acres of land in the Highline area of King County.

3. Any property acquired with financial aid through the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation will be placed in use as an outdoor recreation facility and be retained in such use in perpetuity unless as otherwise provided and agreed to by the County Council, the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation, and any affected Federal agency.

4. This motion becomes part of a formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.
